TO: ALL NATURAL GAS CUSTOMERS OF CHESAPEAKE UTILITIES CORPORATION AND, IN PARTICULAR, THOSE WITHIN THE TOWN OF BRIDGEVILLE AND OTHER INTERESTED PERSONS

On May 16, 2025, Chesapeake Utilities Corporation ("Chesapeake" or the "Company") filed with the Delaware Public Service Commission ("the Commission") an application requesting permission to change its gas service tariff to implement a Town of Bridgeville Franchise Fee Rider ("TBFF") surcharge to be assessed against Chesapeake's gas customers within the Town of Bridgeville. The TBFF surcharge, in the amount of \$0.0100 per Ccf of delivered gas, would mirror the volumetric franchise fee that the Town of Bridgeville imposes on Chesapeake under a franchise agreement adopted by the Town of Bridgeville on April 14, 2025, for the use of the Bridgeville's public roads and rights-of-way. The surcharge would be applied only to Chesapeake's customers within the Town of Bridgeville.

On June 18, 2025, the Commission suspended the proposed surcharge until further order of the Commission. The Commission will consider whether to grant Chesapeake's application for this surcharge at its regularly scheduled meeting on Wednesday, July 23, 2025, commencing at

1:00 P.M. The meeting will be held in the Commission's office located at 861 Silver Lake Boulevard, Cannon Building, Suite 100, Dover, Delaware 19904. The Commission will render a decision based upon the evidence presented to it at this meeting.

If you wish to formally participate as a party in this matter, with the right to present evidence and be represented by counsel, you must file with the Commission a written petition asking for leave to intervene in accordance with the requirements of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (26 *Del. Admin. C.* §1001-2.9) *on or before Monday July* 7, 2025. All such petitions should be e-filed according to the Commission's Rules (26 *Del. Admin. C.* §1001-1.6.4). Petitions filed after the deadline of July 7, 2025, will not be considered except for good cause shown.

If you wish, you may file written comments concerning this application on or before Monday, July 7, 2025.
