On August 12, 2024, the Delaware Division of Chesapeake Utilities Corporation ("Chesapeake" or the "Company") filed with the Delaware Public Service Commission (the "Commission") an application (the "Application") for approval: to increase its natural gas rates; to charge two new Miscellaneous Service Charges; to restructure its rate schedules; to modify its transportation program; to implement a weather normalization mechanism ("WNA") for

residential and small commercial customers; to effect a transfer of the Company's business to a new subsidiary, to be called Chesapeake Utilities of Delaware, Inc.; and to make other tariff changes. In its Application, Chesapeake sought to increase its annual operating revenues by \$12.1 million, or an increase of 15 percent over current revenues. The Company also requested to transfer \$996,660 of revenues currently recovered through its Distribution System Improvement Charge ("DSIC") into base distribution rates. On December 11, 2024, a Commission hearing examiner conducted a duly-noticed public comment teleconference.

On March 12, 2025, the parties to this case filed a Phase I Proposed Settlement, in which the parties agreed to certain terms, including a revenue increase of \$6.1 million to be apportioned on an equal-percentage basis to the volumetric distribution rates of all rate classes, as well as new depreciation rates. The parties agreed to defer several issues, including rate design, the proposed WNA, and other tariff changes, to a Phase II of this proceeding. On May 6, 2025, a Commission hearing examiner conducted an evidentiary hearing regarding the Phase I Proposed Settlement and, on June 18, 2025, the Commission adopted the Phase I Proposed Settlement, by Order No. 10753.

On September 25, 2025, the parties reached, in principle, a Phase II Proposed Settlement, under which the Company agreed to withdraw its request for a WNA and the parties agreed to a modified rate, which includes moving from three declining rate blocks to two for residential customers and increased fixed customer charges. The parties also agreed to certain tariff changes, including modifications to the Company's transportation program and line extension policy, as well as moving from billing in Ccf (100 cubic feet) to Therms (100,000 BTUs).

At the October 15, 2025 evidentiary hearing, the Commission will consider the Phase II Proposed Settlement. Evidentiary hearings are conducted to formally introduce evidence into the record and to make available for cross-examination the parties' witnesses' testimony, including

testimony that may be offered with respect to the Proposed Phase II Settlement. Members of the public are invited to attend the evidentiary hearing as observers, but only the parties are permitted to present witnesses or cross-examine witnesses. In accordance with 26 *Del. C.* §305 and 29 *Del. C.* §10128, the Commission will make its decision concerning this matter on the basis of the record evidence presented to it at the public evidentiary hearing.

Anyone who plans to attend any portion of the evidentiary hearing is cautioned to consult the Commission's website on the day of the hearing for cancellation or changes to the time, place or date of the event.
