Chesapeake Utilities Corporation’s Gas Sales Service Rates Application

On September 2, 2025, Chesapeake Utilities Corporation (“Chesapeake” or the “Company”) filed with the Delaware Public Service Commission (the “Commission”) an application (the “Application”) pursuant to 26 *Del. C.* §§303(b), 304, and 306 seeking to change its Gas Sales Service (“GSR”) Rates as follows:

RS-1, ERS-1, RS-2, ERS-2, USA-R, GS, EGS, USA-G, MVS, EMVS, USA-M, LVS	\$0.995 per Ccf	\$1.238 per Ccf
GLR, GLO	\$0.505 per Ccf	\$0.679 per Ccf
HLFS	\$0.813 per Ccf	\$1.035 per Ccf

Compared to the rates currently in effect, an average residential space heating customer using 700 Ccf per year will experience an annual increase of approximately 18.64%, or \$16.51 per month. During the winter heating season, a typical RS-2 customer using 120 Ccf per winter month will experience an increase of approximately 21.14%, or \$33.96 per winter month.

The Company has also proposed the following changes to its firm and interruptible balancing rates for transportation customers:

By Order No. 10825 dated October 15, 2025, the Commission has permitted the proposed GSR and other rates to become effective with usage on and after November 1, 2025, subject to refund and pending the Commission's final decision after evidentiary hearings and any other proceedings that may be necessary.

The Commission will conduct an evidentiary hearing, to be scheduled at a later date, concerning this Application. The Commission's final decision will be based on the entire record of the case.

If you wish to formally participate as a party in this matter, with the right to present evidence and be represented by counsel, you must file with the Commission a written petition asking for leave to intervene in accordance with the requirements of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (26 Del. Admin. C. §1001-2.9) **on or before Monday, November 17, 2025**. All such petitions should be e-filed according to the Commission's Rules (26 Del. Admin. C. §1001-1.6.4). Petitions filed after the deadline of November 17, 2025, will not be considered except for good cause shown.

Interested persons may file objections to the proposed changes to the GSR, firm and interruptible balancing rates, and the accompanying proposed tariff revisions set forth in the Application. Such objections or written comments shall be filed **on or before Monday, November 17, 2025** using the Commission's file management system, DelaFile (<https://delafile.delaware.gov>), and by searching for Docket No. 25-0834.
